David Rutherford, RSCDS Book 18
$\left.\begin{array}{ll}\text { 1-8 } & \text { 1C slip step down for } 4 \text { steps and back, cast } \\ & \text { to 2nd places and meet in centre } 2 \mathrm{H}\end{array}\right)$

THE MACHINE WITHOUT HORSES (J8x32) 3C (4C Set), David Rutherford (1772), RSCDS Book 12
1-8 1 C set, cast down \& dance RH across with 3C
9-16 1C set, cast up \& dance LH across with 2 C
17-24 1C followed by 2C (who dance up to top and then) dance down, cast up behind 3C, dance in \& dance up to top \& 1C cast back to 2nd place
25-32 2C+1C dance R\&L
SEANN TRUIBHAS WILLICHAN (S8x32) 2C (4C Set)
Thomas Wilson (19th C), RSCDS Book 27
1-8 1 C cast \& dance down behind own lines, turn outwards \& dance back to top
9-16 $1 \mathrm{~W}+2 \mathrm{M}$ set \& change places RH while $1 \mathrm{M}+2 \mathrm{~W}$ change places \& set \& repeat
17-24 1C lead down for 2 steps, turn RH, lead up to top \& cast to 2nd place
25-32 $2 \mathrm{C}+1 \mathrm{C}$ set \& turn partner 2 H opening out to circle 4 H round to left

THE COLLEGE HORNPIPE (R8x32) 3C (4C set) Boag (1797), RSCDS Book 20
1-8 $1 \mathrm{C}+2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}$ circle 6 H round and back, all remaining in centre with partner ready for...
9-16 1C+2C+3C Promenade
17-24 1C cross RH, cast to 2 nd place (2C step up 19-20), cross LH, cast to 3rd place and lead up to face 1st corners
25-32 1C dance 'Hello-Goodbye' setting ending with a clap and petronella turn to 2nd places

MONYMUSK (S8x32) 3C (4C Set)
Preston (1786), RSCDS Book 11
1-8 1C turn RH \& cast to 2nd place, turn 1-1/4 times LH to end 1W between 2C to face 1 M between 3C
9-16 2C+1C+3C set twice 1C turning (bars 11-12) onto opposite sides \& all set twice again on sides
17-24 $2 \mathrm{C}+1 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}$ circle 6 H round \& back
25-32 1C dance reels of 3 on sides giving RSh to person on their Right \& 1C cross RH to places

## ROUND REEL OF EIGHT (R88) Sq. Set RSCDS Book 27

1-16 All Women cast \& dance clockwise round outside of set \& back to place, Men repeat Figure but cast \& dance anticlockwise round set
17-32 All dance Grand Chain $1 / 2$ way \& set to partner, continue Chain back to place \& set to partner
33-40 1C+3C change places 1 C dance between 3 C , repeat Figure back to places, 3C dancing between 1C \& 1C+3C turn RH into Allemande hold
41-48 $\quad 1 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}$ dance round inside of set anticlockwise in Allemande hold
49-64 2C+4C repeat Figure in bars 33-48
65-88 1C+3C dance 1/2 R\&L, 2C+4C dance 1/2 R\&L, repeat back to places, all circle 8 H round \& back

THE ISLE OF SKYE (R8x32) 3C (4C Set)
Thomas Wilson (1816), RSCDS Book 10
1-8 $\quad 1 \mathrm{C}+2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}$ set twice \& cross (Women under Men's arches passing partner RSh)
9-16 $1 \mathrm{C}+2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}$ repeat to places
17-24 1C lead down the middle, up to top \& turn inward to face 2C
25-32 1C set twice to 2 C \& turn opposite dancer with 2 H 1-1/2 times to end in 2nd places

\section*{THE HAYMAKERS (J4x48) 4C Set}
[Based on Sir Roger de Coverly, an early version published in The Dancing Master, 9th edition (1695). The dance's steps are reminiscent of a hunted fox going in and out of cover.]

1-8 \(1 \mathrm{~W}+4 \mathrm{M}\) turn RH \& back to place, \(1 \mathrm{M}+4 \mathrm{~W}\) turn RH \& back to place
9-16 Repeat with LH turns
17-24 Repeat with 2 hand turns
25-32 Repeat with Back-to-Back (DoSiDo)
33-40 Repeat with a bow \& courtesy
41-48 1C cast to bottom on own sides followed by \(2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}+4 \mathrm{C}\), form an arch \& \(2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}+4 \mathrm{C}\) dance under to new places

9-16 1C lead down the middle \& back to top
17-24 1C+2C dance Allemande
25-32 \(2 \mathrm{C}+1 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}\) circle 6 H round \& back
THE GUIDMAN OF BALANGIGH (J8x32) 2C (4C Set) Playford (1728), RSCDS Book 30
1-8 1C dance down between 2C \& cast back to places, \(1 \mathrm{M}+2 \mathrm{M}\) nearer hands joined dance across between 1W \& 2W, divide \& dance back to places
9-16 \(1 \mathrm{~W}+2 \mathrm{~W}\) nearer hands joined dance across between 1 M \& 2 M , divide \& dance back to places, 2C dance up \& cast back to places
17-24 1M+2W set advancing, twirl \& dance back to places, 1W+2M repeat this Figure
25-32 1C+2C dance 4H (skip change) round \(1 / 2\) way, set \& cross RH

MY ONLY JO \& DEARIE, O (S8x32) 3C (4C Set)
Thomas Wilson (1816), RSCDS Book 21
1-8 1 W followed by \(2 \mathrm{~W}+3 \mathrm{~W}\) dance across, cast down behind Men \& dance up own side to places
9-16 Men repeat above Figure (Bars 1-8)
17-24 1C+2C Promenade
25-32 1C+3C dance Diamond Poussette 1C ending in 2nd place (2C step up 25-26)

YE'LL AYE BE WELCOME BACK AGAIN (S8x32)
3C (4C set) Castle Menzies RSCDS Book 7
1-8 \(1 \mathrm{C}+2 \mathrm{C}\) set twice, \(1 \mathrm{M}+2 \mathrm{~W}\) also \(1 \mathrm{~W}+2 \mathrm{M}\) turn 2 H ( 1 M dances across the top to turn 2 W on Woman's side and crosses up diagonally to own place to face out while 1W dances down diagonally to turn on Men's side crossing back to own place to face in)
9-16 1M casts down own side as 1 W dances down the middle, dance round the 3 C and 1 M dances up the middle as 1 W casts up own side, cross RH at top and cast to face 1st corners
17-24 1C turn 1st corners RH, partner LH, 2nd corner RH, partner LH to face 1st corners
25-32 1C dance reels of 3 on opposite sides giving LSh to 1st corners and cross RH to 2nd place own sides

DUKE OF KENT'S WALTZ (W8x32) 3C (4C Set)
Cahusac (1801), Whetherly Book 24
1-8 \(1 \mathrm{C}+2 \mathrm{C}\) RH across, LH back
9-16 1C dance down the middle and cast into 3rd place, \(2 \mathrm{C}+3 \mathrm{C}\) moving up on bars 7-8
17-20 All 4 couples give right hand to partner and balance forward and back and cross by the right, Men turning partners under their arms
21-24 Repeat \& cross back with LH
25-32 All turn the dancer diagonally to their right with RH, turn partner LH
